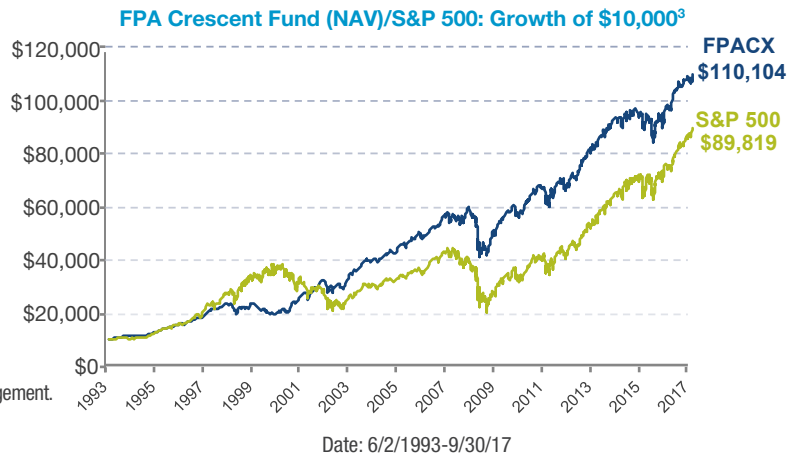

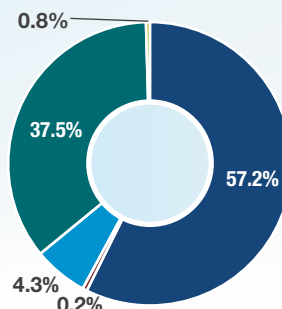

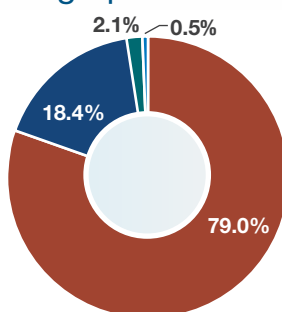
## Portfolio Structure

## Fund Risks
